"The Coin Chronicles: Numismatics of the Islamic World" Photo Exhibition

18th February – 16th April 2020

The Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia (IAMM) is pleased to present "The Coin Chronicles: Numismatics of the Islamic World" photography exhibition, which will be opening its doors to the public beginning 18th February 2020 until 16th April 2020.

The Coin Chronicles: Numismatics of the Islamic World explores the history of coins from Muslim dynasties in relation to the expansion of political influence, power, religion, and significance of Islamic art.

The people in the Arab regions mainly accepted and used Byzantine and Sassanian coins prior to the arrival of Islam. The first truly recognised Islamic coin was introduced during the reign of 'Abd al-Malik ibn Marwan, the fifth ruler of the Umayyad dynasty, who inscribed the *shahadah* (proclamation of faith) on his coins. Such a major change became the favoured design for Islamic coins over centuries.

Over time, as Islam spread beyond the Arab world, the design of Islamic coins also embraced the diverse cultures of the people who accepted Islam. This in return stimulated the development and adoption of various forms and symbols associated to the Islamic faith. The exhibition thus showcases

how the different breakthroughs Islamic art were indeed brought forth through the design of coins, as

can be seen in the various types of calligraphy and iconography explored.

Chronologically arranged to ease the visitor's understanding of the storyline, the exhibition is

amplified by the photographs of coins and artefacts from the collection of the Islamic Arts Museum

Malaysia. The beauty of the exhibition lies not only in strength of the historical narratives but also in

the versatile use of coins as decorative elements in their own right, as used in weaponry and jewellery.

The signs and symbolic images used on the coins are also reflected on architectural façades.

In conjunction with this exhibition, the IAMM Education Department has planned an exciting "Make

Your Own Currency" workshop which will be held on Sunday, 15th March 2020. The workshop is

suitable for children 5 years and older and opened for families (4 pax maximum per family; minimum

1 adult 1 child). The commitment fee is RM 25 per family. Participants of this workshop will have the

opportunity to showcase their artistic skills and creativity to bring home their own hand-made

currency.
