Launching of the 25th anniversary of the Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia

The Islamic Arts Museum
Malaysia celebrated its silver
jubilee with the launch of two
major exhibitions; "A Journey
through Islamic Art" and
"Alif Lam Ra: Contemporary
Muslim Calligraphy" from 13
December 2023 to 30 June
2023. The launching ceremony
was officiated by the Prime
Mnister of Malaysia, Yang Amat
Berhormat Dato' Seri Anwar bin
Ibrahim.

The two exhibitions, held in Special Galleries 1 and 2 highlight an exceptional breadth of designs and craftsmanship of the Islamic world, making it a feast for the eyes and for inquiring minds.

'A Journey through Islamic
Art' presents the progress of
IAMM's development, featuring
nearly every type of artefact
from its collection. These
include masterpieces from the
permanent galleries as well as
the most recent acquisitions,
which have never been
displayed before in any of the
permanent galleries.

Within this exhibition there are five categories: 'In the Name of Allah', 'God Is Beautiful and He Loves Beauty', 'Let the Scribe









Write', 'Victory from Allah' and 'Seek Knowledge'. This division showcases the diversity of objects needed to narrate the heritage of interconnected regions of the world across geography and time.

From the artefacts displayed, visitors are able to get up close and enter the world of master craftsmen, elite ateliers, royal patronage, and the artists that carried Islamic art to such

great heights. Complementing 'A Journey' is the 'Alif Lam Ra' exhibition, which highlights the continuity of Islamic art as a living successor to traditional forms. A wide-ranging display of works by contemporary Muslim calligraphers invites visitors to witness the evolution of calligraphy as the supreme medium of expression within Islam. With more than 42 artists from Japan to Jordan and from Iran to Malaysia, 'Alif Lam Ra'

traces the most recent steps on the journey that started with early calligraphers' devotion to the revealed word of God. It has now culminated with contemporary innovations in ways of presenting words and letters as artistic expressions.

Since its inception, IAMM has strived to become an established centre of learning and research in order to preserve the history,

arts and cultural heritage of the Islamic world. The museum's exhibitions would be incomplete without its educational programmes. A variety of events such panel talks, educational activities and calligraphy workshops are scheduled not only to celebrate IAMM's journey but to ensure the museum continues to be the preserver, custodian and educator of Islamic arts.

Complementing the exhibition and the 25th anniversary, IAMM has published two catalogues; 'A Journey through Islamic Art' and 'Alif Lam Ra: Contemporary Muslim Calligraphy'.

The 'Journey' catalogue features over 150 artefacts that have been selected to represent the extraordinary diversity of Islamic art over a quarter of a century — since the museum's opening in 1998. 'Alif Lam Ra',

on the other hand, presents some of the best contemporary works of calligraphy in the IAMM collection and also forms the second volume of IAMM's 'Contemporary Muslim Calligraphy' series of publications.





Experts' Talk and Panel Discussion

The Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia celebrated its 25th anniversary in December with a number of activities, including hosting a series of workshops and an expert talk. On 13 December 2023, IAMM welcomed Dr Farouk Yahya (Research Associate at SOAS, University of London), William Robinson (Former Head of Research and Evaluation at Christie's) and Dr Amir Zerkgoo (Honorary Professor at the University of Tehran), who presented papers on 'Southeast Asia in the Study of Islamic Art', 'Qajar Paintings: Architectural Relationships' and 'What is Islamic about Islamic Art'? 

Demonstration of Arabic Calligraphy by Fuad Kouichi Honda

13 December 2023 - With worldwide recognition for his creativity and inspiration, Honda's paintings showcase a strong connection between the Qur'an and calligraphy, a prominent feature of Islamic art. This exclusive event offered a rare opportunity for calligraphy students and enthusiasts to witness the master at work. Participants were able to see a calligraphy demonstration by Honda, who also shared his thoughts on the philosophy and practice of calligraphy. Participants brought along their own artwork and received valuable advice from Mr Honda.











Reaching for the Stars: Exploring the Astrolabe

14 December 2023 - This was an interactive and thoughtprovoking workshop on the astrolabe, a highly sophisticated astronomical instrument that was widely used in the Islamic world for over 1,000 years. Led by Dr Silke Ackermann, this workshop helped to contextualise the meaning of Islamic science and focused on what unites rather than divides us across the world.


Dr Ackermann is the Director of the History of Science Museum at the University of Oxford (UK), following 16 years at the British Museum in a range of curatorial and managerial roles. Her main research interest is the transfer of knowledge between the Islamic world and Europe. 16 December 2023



16 December 2023 - Ahar paper, coated with starch, alum and egg whites, features a glossy surface preventing ink absorption. This allows calligraphers to easily make corrections, enhancing the beauty of intricate Islamic calligraphy with its unique texture and durability.

The workshop offered participants a first-hand experience in making Ahar paper with Puan Citi J. Yousoff, including demonstrations of materials and ingredients as participants actively engaged in preparing and applying this unique art.





workshop was designed as an immersive-experience Tezhib course. To understand the rich art of Tezhib, participants were guided to complete a simplified Tezhib project, gaining a feel for the art form, its challenges and its rewards within four hours. All necessary materials, including specialised Tezhib tools and paints, were provided for the participants. The outcome was full immersion in this art.

Maedah Hosseiny graduated from Azad University of Mashhad with a degree in mathematics. She worked as a maths teacher before picking up art and found a strong passion for it. Hosseiny

Puan Citi J. Yousoff, who specialises in Islamic calligraphy under Hasan Celebi in Turkey, attained her Ijaza in Thuluth and Naskh scripts in 2012. She graduated from Wimbledon School of Art, holds an MA in Visual Islamic and Traditional Arts from the Prince's School of Traditional Arts, London. Her art blends Islamic calligraphy with traditional motifs, reflecting both her heritage and contemporary artistic background.

Manifestasi Perdana Seni Khat 2023

On 11 November 2023, the Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia hosted the 7th edition of the Manifestasi Perdana Seni Khat, a national calligraphy competition in collaboration with Persatuan Seni Khat Kebangsaan (PSKK). This muchawaited competition had been delayed since 2020 due to the spread of Covid-19. With two main categories ('Spontaneous on Paper' — divided into three subcategories: Adults, Secondary and Primary





School — and 'Contemporary Calligraphy Painting on Canvas'), it began with a workshop by Ustaz Abdul Baki Abu Bakar, a renowned calligrapher, to help participants prepare for the competition. The prize-giving ceremony was held on the next day, 12 November, led by Dr Abdul Rahman, President of the PSKK. With over 100 participants taking part this year, IAMM, in cooperation with PSKK, remains hopeful to continue the event as a platform for aspiring calligraphers with the aim of preserving Islamic calligraphy whilst fostering deeper appreciation for this form of Islamic art and its essential legacy.








Visit by HSH Prince Albert II of Monaco
